

Five and Ten Cent Coins



This is a five cent coin. It can be written "5 c".



This is a ten cent coin. It can be written "10 c".

In the exercises we use small pictures of these coins. The 5 c coin is the smallest, and the 10 c coin is largest. They are both silver coloured.



Count up →

10 c 20 c 25 c 30 c 35 c 40 c

To find the total value, add the cent values. It's called counting up. Start counting with the coins of the largest value.

The total on the left is 40 c.
